Women aged 40 to 69 can access breast cancer screening services at Family Health Centers, KETEMs, and **Mobile Cancer** Screening Vehicles.

## BREAST CANCER IS NOT A BAD FATE

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Breast cancer can be detected at an early stage.

Breast cancer is highly treatable when diagnosed early.

## **Breast Check-up**

Women should perform **breast self-examinations** every month from the age of 20.

Breast self-examinations should ideally be performed once a month **7-10 days after the menstrual period starts.** 

Women who do not have periods i.e. have reached menopause should perform breast self-examinations on the same day every month.

Women aged **20 to 40** should have a clinical breast exam performed by a health professional **once every 2 years.** 

From the age of 40, women should have a clinical breast exam performed by a health professional once a year.

## For early diagnosis, women should;

perform breast selfexaminations regularly,

have clinical breast examinations by health professionals, and

have mammograms.



## Mammography

Women should have a mammogram every two years from the age of 40.

The best time to do a mammogram is the first week after menstruation when breasts feel least tender.
